What is Elks Camp Barrett?

Elks Camp Barrett is an American Camping Association accredited camp, designed to help young people in all backgrounds develop and grow by affording the opportunity of getting outdoors for adventure and fun. It is operated by the Elks Association of Maryland, Delaware and the District of Columbia. Campers are sponsored by local Elks Lodges and a portion of the cost of camp is covered by that sponsorship.

Who can go to Camp?

Any youth between the ages of 9 and 13 (or completed 3rd grade) from the Maryland, Delaware or the Washington, D.C. area is eligible. They do not have to be needy but should be worthy and deserving or one who would not otherwise have such an opportunity for a camping experience.

How do you apply for Camp Barrett?

Families who are interested in sending their child to Elks Camp Barrett should contact an Elks Lodge in their area. A Camp Barrett Representative from that Lodge will provide a registration packet and can answer any questions you may have about the camp and the registration process. Camp weeks fill quickly. Spaces are not guaranteed and fill on a first come first served basis.

The purpose of Camp Barrett's Camping program is to provide experiences for the camper such as:

Group Living in outdoor surroundings, recreational oriented activities that emphasize physical, mental, social and emotional growth.

What Types of activities are available at ECB?

Elks Camp Barrett is a traditional summer camping program in every sense, but in addition to those tried and true summer camp programs, ECB offers the opportunity for campers to choose from an array of special programs that may interest them.

Some of our Traditional Summer camp activities include:

Carnival night, Dances, Karaoke, Water games, Guest speakers, Independence day party, Ice cream making, Flag building and Cabin competitions.

While at the Elks Camp Barrett, the campers are divided into individual groups with their own cabins. The activities are under the supervision of camp counselors, which assures more personal care. Boys and girls attend on different weeks, but have access to the same traditional and special camp programs. Meals are carefully prepared to be tasty and nutritious and are served in a family style setting. Health staff is on the property or on call at all times. Campers are encouraged to participate in camp activities. There is plenty of opportunity for campers to develop friendships and enjoy the quite beauty of nature.
