The Maryland, Delaware, and District of Columbia Elks Association operates Elks Camp Barrett.

The camp is located in Annapolis, Maryland, on over 187 acres of woodlands, creeks, and open spaces.

What is Elks Camp Barrett?

Elks Camp Barrett is an American Camping Association-accredited camp designed to help young people from all backgrounds develop and grow by affording the opportunity of getting outdoors for adventure and fun. It is operated by the Elks Association of Maryland, Delaware, and the District of Columbia. Local Elks Lodges sponsor campers, and all, or a portion of the cost of the camp, is covered by that sponsorship.

Who may attend Camp?

Any youth between the ages of 9 and 13 (or who completed 3rd grade) from the Maryland, Delaware, or Washington, D.C. area is eligible. They do not have to be needy but should be worthy and deserving or one who would not otherwise have such an opportunity for a camping experience.

How do you apply for Camp Barrett?

Families interested in sending their child to Elks Camp Barrett should contact an Elks Lodge in their area. A Camp Barrett Representative from that Lodge will provide a pre-registration packet and answer any questions about the camp and the registration process. Camp weeks fill quickly. Spaces are not guaranteed and are filled on a first-come-first-serve basis.

The purpose of Camp Barrett's Camping program is to provide experiences for the camper such as:

- Group living in outdoor surroundings, recreationally oriented activities that emphasize physical, mental, social and emotional growth
- Opportunities for character development
- Self-worth development
- Self Improvement by working with and helping others

The goals of the program are to:

- Develop campers' appreciation and knowledge of themselves and their peers
- Develop leadership through creative adventure and activities
- Provide leadership that will be an example of the principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love, and Fidelity

Elks Camp Barrett is a traditional summer camping program in every sense, still in addition to those tried and true summer camp programs, ECB offers the opportunity for campers to choose from an array of special programs that may interest them.*
