While at the Elks Camp Barrett, the campers are divided into individual groups with their own cabins. The activities are supervised by camp counselors, which ensures more personal care. All have access to the same traditional and unique camp programs. (For those new to residential camping, you have the option to return home in the evenings.)

Meals are carefully prepared to be tasty and nutritious and served in a family setting.

Health staff are always on the property or on-call. Campers are encouraged to participate in camp activities and have plenty of opportunities to develop friendships and enjoy the quiet beauty of nature.

All Camp programs are conducted with concern for the campers' needs and safety. Every camp activity is performed with respect for the environment, and campers are encouraged to be good earth stewards.

Who may attend Camp?

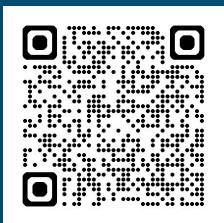

What types of activities are available at Elks Camp Barrett?

Elks Camp Barrett is a traditional summer camping program in every sense; still, in addition to those tried and true summer camp programs, ECB offers the opportunity for campers to choose from an array of special programs that may interest them.*

Some of our traditional summer Camp activities include:

Swimming, Archery, Nature Study, Camp Fire Programs, Arts and Crafts, a carefully supervised Marksmanship Range (pellets) and Hiking.

Our Special programming is updated every season and may include:

- Computer building, Woodworking, Herb Gardening, Farm to Table Skills, Forestry, Entomology (Bugs), Ice cream making, Embryology, Improvisation & drama, Dance, Games, Nest building, Beginning Yoga, Pickleball, Robotics, Fishing Derby, and various team sports.
